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1. THE ORIGIN OF PEACE

The present president and executive director of PEACE Mr. Bhikari Charana Behera had been participating in different social activities like cleaning of medicals, streets at muddy, school building at dirty during his schooling period in remote tribal pocket Mohana under so called Ganjam district of Odisha in Indian soil. His college period is covered by participating and leading the social and cultural activities amongst the students. He was elected the President of a registered social institution namely Maharaja Krushnachandra Gajapati Yubak Sangha, Mohana during 1984-86 and then secretary of Neelachala Sanskrutika Sangha, Mohana during 1987-90. The knowledge and experience of both the organizations and activities in the colleges mass boast him to start a statewide network organization namely PEACE involving a group of dedicated social minded people during 1993-94. The activities of PEACE has been started just after the registration during 1993-94 in Ganjam and Gajapati district.

2. LEGAL STATUS

PEACE a society registered under Societies Registration Act (XXI), 1860 at Ganjam District of Odisha, afterwards it reregistered under IGR,Cuttack,Odisha. Income Tax Act, 12AA and Income Tax Act, 80G.

The strategic approach for development of a community is of two ways: first, community approach i.e. when the community is considered as one unit, the families and individuals are involuntarily included in the process of development. Second, individual approach i.e. each individuals are considered as units of development which evidently a cause for the development of that family as well as of the community.

Here at Mohana Block though there are 39 GPS but some of the GPS are very inaccessible. The very inaccessible GPS namely-Katama, Paniganda, Damadua, Dambaguda, Adava and Karchabadi are attached with Maa Gruha, Mohana to serve the pregnant mothers for their institution delivery. The above GPS are in very inaccessible and they situated in most difficult pockets of Mohana Block.


FACILITIES AVAILABLE AT MAA GRUHA

The MAA GRUHA /Maternity Waiting Home at B.Khajuripada under Nuagada Block has opened during November -2017 with the partner of Government of Odisha, Department of Health, NHM having a MOU with the district administration Gajapati.

✤ OBJECTIVES OF MAA GRUHA

To establish alternative supports infrastructure for addressing communication problem in difficult and inaccessible pockets for ensuring institution delivery.

All the Gram Panchayats under Nuagada Block are situated in accessible pockets. The very inaccessible GPS namely- Anugurr, Kirama, Sambalapur, Udayapur, Tabarada



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and Luhangara are attached with Maa Gruha, B. Khajuripada to serve the pregnant mothers for their institution delivery. The above GPS are in very inaccessible and they situated in most difficult pockets with reference to communication.

FACILITIES AVAILABLE AT MAA GRUHA



The Pregnant mothers of targeted area are motivated by the staffs of Maa Gruha, B.Khajuripada at their door step and also at VHND points to stay at Maa Gruha before 10 to 15 days of their expected date of delivery.

The inmates were provided recreation facilities at Maa Gruha like TV, CD player etc. On onset of delivery pain the mother were shifted to nearest Community Health Center (CHC) at B.Khajuripada for their institution delivery.







The motivated mothers are shifted to Maa Gruha, B.Khajuripada and allow them to stay up to delivery. The mothers along with a attendant were provided free food and accommodation with regular health check-up.

7. INFORMATION, EDUCATION & COMMUNICATION....

The following activities are taken by the staffs of PEACE under the banner of Important of IEC.

INSTITUTIONAL DELIVERY FOR A MOTHER

An Institutional Delivery gives many benefits like many complications of childbirth can be avoided if delivery takes place in an institution. First 24 hours after delivery are crucial for mothers and newborns. Both should be taken proper care under supervision of Doctor and Nurse. Government has given some fixed amount of money to Mothers who has delivered at Govt. institution.

NUTRITIONAL DIET FOR A MOTHER

Understand why a pregnant woman needs special care including Nutritious meals & rest. A Pregnant woman needs to eat more food so her baby can grow, she should eat one more serving at each meal. And there is no food prohibited for her, she should eat all types of food. Eating Nutritious food such as: Milk, Fruit, Pulses, Eggs, Jaggery, Green Leafy Vegetables, Kaala Chana, Meat etc. during pregnancy will make full strong physically and mentally.

SWACHH BHARAT

Under the banner of Swachh Bharat the volunteers of PEACE taken many more activities like littering and Dispose garbage properly, Maintain Hygiene, Say No to Plastic etc. Under this banner the village people are also motivated to develop avenue plantation in Mohana and Nuagada block.

Awareness on COVID-19 (CORONA VIRUS)

Coronavirus disease (COVID-19) is an infectious disease caused by the SARS-CoV-2 virus. Most people who fall sick with COVID-19 will experience mild to moderate symptoms and recover without special treatment. However, some will become seriously ill and require medical attention.

HOW IT SPREADS

The virus can spread from an infected person's mouth or nose in small liquid particles when they cough, sneeze, speak, sing or breathe. These particles range from larger respiratory droplets to smaller aerosols.

You can be infected by breathing in the virus if you are near someone who has COVID-19, or by touching a contaminated surface and then your eyes, nose or mouth. The virus spreads more easily indoors and in crowded settings.

Preventive Steps for COVID-19

The entire team of PEACE takes the following steps to prevent from COVID-19 in Gajapati District.

- 1. Create awareness on 5 steps of Hand wash
- 2. Maintaining social distance among the people
- 3. Using Mask properly
- 4. Convince the people on important of Sanitization





AROGYA PLUS/Mobile Health Unit at doorstep of people.....



Nuagada Block is one of the sub plan Block of Odisha under the District of Gajapati. Most of the villages are situated in very inaccessible pockets where there is no communication facility for the people to reach medical facility centers at the time of need. The Gram Panchayata namely Anuguru, Kirama, Sambalapur, Udayapur and Sundardanga are the most interior pockets where there are available health facilities due to lack no of communications.

Hence PEACE is decided to start a Mobile Health Unit namely Arogya plus to provide health facilities at doorstep of the people. A team of health personals of PEACE with help of NHM, Gajapati reached every villages of above GPs and distribute medicines to the people in need since 2017-2018.





The Arogya Plus team of PEACE at Nuagada Block do RAT / RTPCR test under the guidance of CHC, B. Khajuripada and CDMO, Gajapati. The team monitoring the temporary COVID-19 hospital and provide medicines to inmates whose coming from outside of Odisha.









Safe and effective vaccines are an important tool, in combination with other measures, to protect people against COVID-19, save lives and reduce wide scale social disruption.

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VILLAGE DISASTER MANAGEMENT PLAN, GAJAPATI (VDMP)......



Disaster Management Plan means prevention of threat of any disaster reduction of risk of any disaster or its consequences.

The Gajapati District face risk of Flood, Drought, Cyclone and Land Slide, Heat Waves etc., since last 7 years. Many times the disaster incidences had been occurred suddenly which could not be addressed promptly by the District Authority.





Hence the State Disaster Management Cell, Odisha made plan to do survey the villages and set a disaster management plan sitting with the concern villages to do prompt action and communicate suddenly to Govt. authorities if any disaster will be faced by the village. PEACE has allotted 109 villages of Mohana and Nuagada Block by the **District Disaster Emergency Operation Center, Gajapati** during the Year 2020-2022 to form the village disaster committee through which the Government can

help the people immediately at their disaster.

The Volunteers of PEACE successfully completed 109 village disasters management plans sitting with the local people and submitted same to the District and Block Authorities.


• ORGANIZING GRAIN BANK GROUPS...
